Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Reporting – Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

On March 27th, 2020, the Federal government enacted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), Pub L. No. 116-136, providing funds to institutions from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) to make Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus, including eligible expenses such as food, course materials, technology, health care and child care. The law requires institutions to report certain information related to the use of these funds.

The following information is reported for: September 14, 2020 to October 10, 2020

- 1. The institution signed and returned to the US Department of Education the Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. The institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.

 - b. Meeting Satisfactory Academic Progress
 - c. Be Title IV eligible and not in a verification status
 - d. In good financial standing with the school
 - e. Incurred expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19

The institution will determine the population of eligible students. The total sum available from CARES ACT Grants will be divided equally amongst the eligible students. The amount per student will be posted on the next update.
