Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Reporting – Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students

On March 27th, 2020, the Federal government enacted the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), Pub L. No. 116-136, providing funds to institutions from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) to make Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus, including eligible expenses such as food, course materials, technology, health care and child care. The law requires institutions to report certain information related to the use of these funds.

The following information is reported for: Quarter ending 3/31/21

- 1. The institution signed and returned to the US Department of Education the Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. The institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.

- 5. The total number of students who have received an emergency financial aid grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of the date of this Fund Report is <u>104</u>.
- 6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive emergency financial aid grants and how much they would receive under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act are as follows:
 - a. Active Student as of 5/18/20, or on an approved Leave of Absence and returned by 7/6/20 or Graduated in April 2020.
 - b. Meeting Satisfactory Academic Progress
 - c. Be Title IV eligible and not in a verification status
 - d. In good financial standing with the school
 - e. Incurred expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19

The total sum available from CARES ACT Grants was divided amongst the eligible students that returned the application provided. The students that answered yes to questions on the application received \$1218.00 and the students that answered no received \$601.00. The school did transition to online learning temporarily and felt the entire student body deserved something for the inconvenience and some had graduation dates extended.
