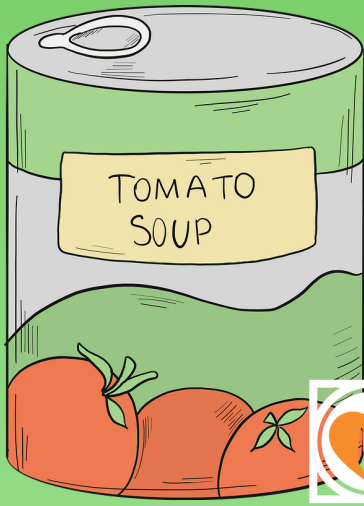

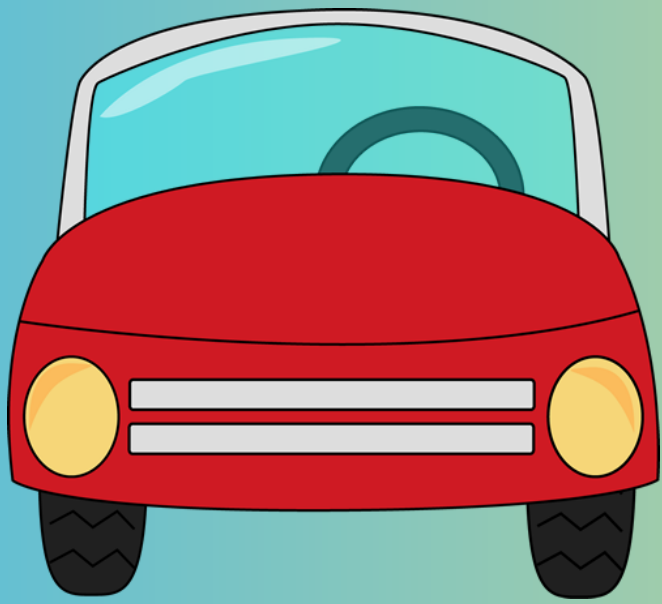

Studying Tips and Resources

Do you need help preparing for a test? The 10 tips below can help you study for your next exam:

1. **KNOW WHAT TO EXPECT:** Find out what material will be covered and what type of questions will be on the test.
2. **THINK LIKE YOUR INSTRUCTOR:** Review your notes, homework, quizzes, handouts, and classwork. These can give you clues about what's important.
3. **MAKE YOUR OWN STUDY AIDS:** Turn your notes into flashcards, practice questions, or a mini practice test. Testing yourself is better than simply rereading your notes.
4. **PRACTICE, PRACTICE, PRACTICE:** Work through practice problems and questions similar to what you expect to see on the test.
5. **STUDY A LITTLE EVERY DAY:** Don't wait until the night before. Short, regular study sessions can help you find and fix weak areas early.
6. **ELIMINATE DISTRACTIONS:** Put your phone away, silence notifications, and find a quiet place to focus. Take short breaks to stay fresh.
7. **BREAK IT INTO SMALLER PIECES:** Big topics can feel overwhelming. Divide the material into smaller sections and master one piece at a time.
8. **REVIEW THE "EASY" STUFF, TOO:** Don't ignore material you already know. A quick review can help prevent careless mistakes and forgotten details.
9. **SHOW UP & ASK QUESTIONS:** Attend class and review sessions. If something doesn't make sense, ask your instructor for help before test day.
10. **DO A QUICK REVIEW BEFORE THE TEST:** Refresh your memory with your flashcards, notes, or key concepts. A quick review can help keep important information fresh.



Transportation and Carpooling Resources

Is driving to school every day not an option for you? Is it not cost-effective enough to Uber to and from Brownson either? If any of these are the case, we encourage you to take advantage of local low-cost transportation services listed below!

- **OC Bus (Cost: \$2.00 one-way)**
 - Brownson is located only 0.2 miles away from the Ball-Anaheim bus stop, which is along OCTA Bus Route 46. Scan the QR code below for route info and bus route planning information.
- **OCTA Vanpool Service (Cost: Varies depending on distance)**
 - OCTA Vanpool is an OCTA-subsidized alternative to Uber. You and 6-14 others will rideshare from approximately the same locations. Scan the QR code below for the OCTA Vanpool website.
- **Reaching Out To A Classmate**
 - If there are no good options from OCTA for you, we encourage you to reach out to a classmate to find out if carpooling together is an option for the both of you.
